

Pathway to Leadership in ANPD

The following are examples of activities to consider as you develop your own NPD leadership. You are not restricted to a linear approach or completing everything in one area before moving to more outward facing activities.

ACTIVE MEMBER

Leadership in practice environment

- Maintains current ANPD membership
- Participates in monthly ANPD webinars (live or via recordings)
- Uses NPD Practice Model and Scope and Standards to guide practice
- Regularly reviews NPD in Motion and JNPD publications for the latest practice
- Bases NPD practitioner practice on evidence and best practices
- Participates in surveys and studies distributed to ANPD membership
- Advocates for own development in all NPD 7 roles
- Considers participating in an ANPD Academy

ACTIVE ADVOCATE

Leadership at local or regional level

- Member of local ANPD Affiliate (attend meetings, serve on committee, take leadership role), where available
- Certified in NPD
- Attends ANPD Aspire Convention
- Advocates for the NPD specialty
- Contributes to body of knowledge about NPD practice (NPD in Motion, JNPD articles, webinars, podcasts)
- Submits abstract for poster or concurrent session at ANPD Aspire Convention
- Mentors others in NPD practice

ACTIVE NPD LEADER

Leadership at the national level

- Acts as a subject matter expert, item writer, or reviewer for NPD resources
- Considers advanced NPD certification
- Considers being a mentor in ANPD Academies
- Participates in an ANPD committee or Task Force
- Considers nomination for leadership position on ANPD Board of Directors
